

I.- DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR QUALIFICATIONS RECOGNITION

1. An application, adapted to the model shown on the Ministerio de Sanidad y Política Social web page.

2. A photocopy of the applicant's identity card, passport or equivalent document proving that the applicant is a citizen of one of the European Union Member States or of one of the signatory countries of the Agreement on the European Economic Area.

3. Copies of the applicant's academic qualification(s) and, where relevant, university degree, whose veracity will be checked.

4. A certified and personalized break-down of the applicant's curriculum and training program which will include:

- The duration of studies in academic years.
- A description of the subjects studied, in particular the number of hours spent on each subject, both theory and practice.

(The above certificate is not required for those applying for recognition of training qualifications for: PHYSICIANS WITH BASIC TRAINING, MEDICAL SPECIALISTS, GENERAL CARE NURSES, MIDWIVES, ODONTOLOGISTS, VETERINARY SURGEONS AND PHARMACISTS. However, in cases where possible substantial differences must be determined regarding required Spanish training, such as those laid out in Article 14 of Directive 2005/36, the applicant may be required to provide information about his/her training.)

5. A Certificate of Good Standing issued by the Member State of origin confirming that the interested party is in fact a qualified professional, has not been disqualified, suspended or prohibited to practice, and that he/she fulfills the requirements of the European Union Directive for the practice of his/her profession (the document will not be considered valid unless presented within three months of the date of issue).

6. A document from the competent authority in the Member State of origin certifying that qualifications presented entitle the holder to practice in the country of origin and, furthermore, meets the conditions established in Directive 2005/36/EC.

7. A certificate issued by the competent authority detailing the applicant's professional experience and confirming that he/she has practiced for two years' full time in the last ten years in the Member State issuing the qualification, only in the event that said profession not be regulated in that country.

8. In the event that the qualifications for a physician, medical specialist, general care nurse, odontologist, veterinary surgeon, midwife and pharmacist do not fully meet the training requirements laid out in Chapter III, Title III of Directive 2005/36/EC, certification from the competent authority will be required confirming that the holder

has effectively and legally practiced the activities in question for, at least, three consecutive years within the five years prior to the issuing of the certificate.

II.- DOCUMENTS MUST BE PRESENTED AS FOLLOWS: All documents issued by other E.U. Member States must be accompanied by the corresponding certified translation in Spanish. Authentic copies of required documents must be presented, issued by a notary or by the applications office on presentation of the original document.
